



Massachusetts Psychiatric Society's 30th Annual Psychopharmacology Update

Program Overview

The MPS will host its 30th Annual Psychopharmacology Update on Saturday, November 16, 2019, led by Activity Chair Dr. David Osser. This year's conference will open with a presentation on emergency interventions in psychopharmacology by Dr. Sean Stetson, followed by the 2019 algorithm for the psychopharmacology of schizophrenia presented by Theo Manschreck, MD. Next comes an update on important developments in child and adolescent psychopharmacology by Dr. Anthony

Jackson which will be followed by a presentation on psychopharmacology for behavioral problems of patients with autism spectrum disorders by Dr. Shivaun Gannon from the University of Washington. The day will conclude with Dr. Osser presenting the 2019 algorithm for the psychopharmacology of social anxiety disorder and an opportunity for questions and answers on any topic in psychopharmacology by our panel of speakers.

- Use medications to help with generalized social anxiety disorder in accord with the best evidence for effectiveness and safety
