MACEP opposes Ballot Question 4 over concerns that legalization of psychedelics will increase the likelihood of overdose, especially in minors and individuals with pre-existing or susceptibility to psychotic disorders and bipolar disorders. Moreover, the ballot question includes ibogaine, which has known risks for inducing arrythmia, which can lead to cardiac arrest. Until the science is more conclusive, MACEP would support decriminalization over legalization.
